**Remembrance Sunday** Next Sunday the main Eucharist will be a said service with hymns, at 9.30am, following which congregation are invited to join the cathedral procession to the Cenotaph to join the city's Remembrance Ceremony.

**Durufié Requiem** Also on Sunday 11 November, at 5.30pm, join the Cathedral Choir for a special Remembrance Sunday Requiem Mass, using liturgy that would have been familiar to congregations 100 years ago, at which the choir will be singing Durufié's Requiem. All are welcome. The service will be followed by a Victory Peal for the Centenary, simultaneously rung across the country.

**Visiting Choir** On Thursday 15 November we will welcome Llandaff Cathedral Choir to sing Evensong.
