**Social Justice Meeting** Today, following the 10.00am Cathedral Eucharist, the Social Justice Group will meet. The guest speaker is Tim Snowdon, from the charity Sixty-One, who will share his experiences of prison ministry. All are welcome.

**Chorister Charity Ride** From Saturday 25 May Benji, one of our boy probationers, will be cycling – alongside his mother, Agnieszka – from Bristol to London to raise at least £500 for stem cell treatment for a five year old boy with cerebral palsy.
