**Social Justice Group Charity Work** The Social Justice Group is fundraising for two Bristol-based charities this autumn/winter: Sixty One ([sixty-one.org](http://sixty-one.org)), which produce gift bags for people in prison at Christmas, and 1625 Independent People ([1625ip.co.uk](http://1625ip.co.uk)) who work to prevent young people becoming homeless. **I Look From Afar – A Virtual Advent Retreat** In these unusual and dislocating times we will shortly be moving into the reflective season of Advent. This year the Church of England’s Advent theme is ‘Comfort and Joy’. On Saturday 28 November, the eve of Advent Sunday, we will be sharing a virtual retreat day on our social media, asking where and how we find comfort and joy in a strange land. This will run throughout the day and will comprise seven reflections by different speakers from both within and beyond our Diocese, with opening and closing words by Bishop Viv.
