TODAY

Coffee We are pleased that once again we are able to offer coffee after the 10.00am Sunday Eucharist. Coffee will be served in the South Aisle, and we will be providing individually-wrapped biscuits. Community Meeting Immediately after the 10.00am Eucharist, when you have collected a cup of coffee you are invited to return to your seat in the nave. The Dean will give a presentation on work taking place to set the vision and strategy for the Cathedral as we move forward. There will be an opportunity to contribute to the vision and to give feedback to Chapter, plus a chance to ask about other aspects of Cathedral life.

Visiting Choir We are delighted to welcome The Cecilia Singers, our first visiting choir since before the pandemic. They are singing at the 10.00am Eucharist and Evensong at 3.30pm.

Covid-19 Considerations Although most legal restrictions have now been lifted, we are emerging from lockdown with caution and we request that you note the following arrangements for visiting and worshipping in the Cathedral

Seating In order to maintain spatial distancing, please only sit in a row marked with a green tick.

Communion Communion in one kind will continue to be distributed at stations from both ends of the Cathedral. Please follow directions for when to safely leave your place.


Face Coverings While face coverings are no longer mandatory, we are encouraging visitors and worshippers to wear masks when moving around the building.

Congregational Singing Congregational singing will be permitted and, if at all possible, we ask that those congregation members singing keep their masks on while doing so.

North Transept For those who would prefer to remain spatially distanced from those singing, please sit in the North Transept (see map).

Prayer List From the beginning of August we are now taking a revised approach to our Cathedral prayer list. Congregation members are welcome to nominate people to be included, initially for a period of one month and reviewed by the clergy team monthly thereafter. Please pass prayer requests to a member of the clergy, having first ensured that you have obtained your nominee's permission unless their situation is too severe for you to do so. Those on the list will usually be included by name in the prayers during the weekday Eucharists.
