INSTALLATION OF HONORARY CANONS This afternoon at 3,30pm, Choral Evensong will include the installation of The Revd Derek Maddox, Simon Pugh-Jones, and The Revd Sally Wheeler as Honorary Canons.

CATHEDRAL CLOSURE The Cathedral will be closed for general visiting on Monday 11, Tuesday 12, and Wednesday 13 October, owing to an event taking place in the building. We will remain open for the Eucharist and Evening Prayer only, held in our Sub Croft chapel, and Evensong on Monday and Tuesday will become Evening Prayer. Morning Prayer and Evensong on Wednesday will take place as usual.

CATHEDRAL POETRY FESTIVAL On Thursday 14 October, 4.30pm to 6.00pm, come and hear the poems from the winners of our first Poetry & Faith Competition, as they recite their poems for the first time. This inaugural festival will be compered by Rob Short, educator, global performer, and a pupil of Maya Angelou and Cornel West. The event will include performances from Miles Chambers, Dr Edson Burton, and other acclaimed local poets, as well as the competition winners. With live music and refreshments as well. IN MEMORIAM Until 17 October, Luke Jerram's new touring artwork, *In Memoriam*, is being presented on College Green. The installation is a temporary memorial for the public to visit and remember all those we have lost from the COVID-19 pandemic. *In Memoriam* is also in tribute to all the NHS health and care workers who have been risking their lives during the crisis.
